WHAT IS T.E.A.C.H.?



The T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood[®] Scholarship Program is a national, evidence-based strategy that makes higher education more attainable for early learning educators through the program's shared cost approach. T.E.A.C.H. (Teacher Education And Compensation Helps) provides scholarships and comprehensive support for recipients to work toward state and national credentials, college credits and certificates, or Associate, Bachelor's, and Master's degrees in early childhood education. By

encouraging higher education efforts, the program works to establish a well-qualified, fairly compensated, and stable early learning workforce for Florida's children.

Children

★ 169,109 children were enrolled in early learning programs and family child care homes that employ T.E.A.C.H. scholars in Florida.

Comprehensive Scholarships

T.E.A.C.H. creates a three-way partnership between the scholar (early learning educator), the sponsor (their employer), and the T.E.A.C.H. scholarship program, with all three contributing to the costs for tuition, books, and other related expenses.

- ★ T.E.A.C.H. scholars attended 56 approved training programs, colleges, and universities.
- ★ 99% of sponsors and scholars would recommend T.E.A.C.H. to other early learning educators.

Higher Education

Scholarships require successful completion of a specified number of hours in an approved early childhood credential or degree program.

- Over the last fiscal year, T.E.A.C.H. scholars took 22,370 credit hours.
- T.E.A.C.H. scholars earned an average GPA of **3.41**.

Compensation

To support the economic viability of the early learning workforce, scholars earn a T.E.A.C.H. bonus and most receive a raise or bonus from their employer after the successful completion of a scholarship contract.

- The median wage for T.E.A.C.H. scholars was **\$15.84 per hour.**
- ★ On average, the wages for T.E.A.C.H. scholars increased by **10.65%** over the last fiscal year.

Commitment

Through their scholarship contracts with T.E.A.C.H., scholars commit to staying with their center or home at least six additional months once their credential or degree program is completed.

- The turnover rate for T.E.A.C.H. scholars was **6.2%** compared to a national average of **30-40%**.
- **1,868** early learning programs sponsored at least one T.E.A.C.H. scholar.

Counselors

T.E.A.C.H. counselors promote scholar success by providing academic, career pathway, and administrative support.

- Counselors assisted **2,181** first-time T.E.A.C.H. scholars through the scholarship process.
- ★ 99% of scholars found their T.E.A.C.H. counselor and T.E.A.C.H. staff supportive

High School Career and Technical Education (CTE) Model

The CTE scholarship model offers students graduating from high school career and technical early childhood education programs the opportunity to obtain a National CDA credential. In fiscal year 2023-24, 1,137 students from 21 districts took advantage of this scholarship, with 1,100 credentials completed or in progress to date.
