# WHAT IS HELP ME GROW?

Help Me Grow<sup>®</sup> Florida (HMGF) is a coordinated system of supports that connects children and families to:

- Child developmental and health services
- Virtual resources for children birth to 8
- Parenting tips and information

HMGF is designed to empower families and support their children's healthy development through the implementation of four **Core Components:** 





**Family & Community Outreach** - promotes awareness of HMGF to families and community partners

 Child Healthcare Provider Outreach - motivates and encourages medical providers to collaborate with HMGF to provide more comprehensive services to their patients

**Data Collection and Analysis** - supports evaluation and guides the system to ensure continuous quality improvement



## **AUTHORITY & FUNDING**



The Help Me Grow<sup>®</sup> Florida (HMGF) system is administered by the Children's Forum, Inc. and funded under contract #C1032 by the State of Florida, Division of Early Learning. For fiscal year 2023-2024, the Florida Legislature allocated \$1,808,957 recurring funds from the General Revenue Fund and \$2,691,043 nonrecurring funds from the Child Care and Development Block Grant Trust Fund to support HMGF network. During this period, the HMGF State Coordinating Office contracted with twelve affiliate sites and had a memorandum of understanding with one additional affiliate site that sourced their own funding to implement HMGF in their service area.

# **STATE COORDINATING OFFICE**

The HMGF State Coordinating Office (SCO), located at the Children's Forum, Inc. in Tallahassee, FL is responsible for oversight of the administrative, programmatic, and fiscal activities of the Help Me Grow system at the state level.

The SCO provides technical assistance and other resources to its affiliates to ensure successful implementation of Help Me Grow in their respective counties and areas.

# HELP ME GROW in action

A HMGF care coordinator was contacted by a mother she assisted six years ago. The mother recalled the valuable guidance she received from Help Me Grow for her eldest daughter and sought assistance again upon noticing developmental delays in her twoyear-old son. The care coordinator supported the mother in completing both developmental and behavioral screenings, identifying two areas requiring further assessment and evaluation.

After discussing the results and the mother's concerns, a referral was made to Easterseals Florida Treasure Coast Early Steps. The child was deemed eligible for Early Steps and is now benefiting from their services. Despite the time gap, the parent remembered the help offered by Help Me Grow for her daughter and sought assistance once more for her son.

Books, Balls, & Blocks (BBB) events are free, fun, family community-screening events for families and children. These events are comprised of various activity stations in which children engage in developmentally appropriate play while their parents complete a valid and reliable developmental questionnaire to pinpoint their child's developmental progress. A trained professional will then review the screening results with the caregiver and provide information and referrals to any supports or services needed.

# **OUR ACTIVITIES**

### HELP ME GROW ANNUAL MEETING

The Help Me Grow® Florida (HMGF) Annual Meeting took place on April 17-18th in Orlando, Florida. This gathering offered HMGF affiliates from all over the state a chance to connect, engage in professional growth, and exchange ideas. The event was brimming with valuable insights, allowing affiliates to acknowledge achievements and explore upcoming ventures. Erin Smeltzer, CEO & President of the Children's Forum, delivered an inspiring keynote speech. Following this, a panel on early childhood advocacy featured Cari Miller, Chancellor for Early Learning at the Division of Early Learning, Rachel Tease Ludwig, Vice President of Talent Development for the Future of Work at the Florida Chamber Foundation, and State Representative Dana Trabulsy. Sallie Payne and Patricia Adams from the FDLRS Administration Project delved into Individualized Education Plans and highlighted ways to support families through the process. Maria Avila, the Statewide Early Childhood Coordinator for the Florida Department of Children and Families, along with Heather Pemberton, Program Coordinator for Early Childhood Court, shared insights on Early Childhood Courts and the objectives of the pilot project with HMGF. Michael Winn from RB Oppenheim Associates discussed leveraging the digital marketing, and the meeting concluded with breakout sessions that enabled affiliates to connect with peers in similar roles. Overall, the Annual Meeting was a triumph, igniting innovative ideas and inspiring all attendees.

# **OUR ACTIVITIES CONTINUED**

### **MARKETING CAMPAIGN**

Help Me Grow® Florida (HMGF) partnered with RB Oppenheim Associates this year to enhance the visibility of HMGF statewide in a deliberate and strategic manner. RB Oppenheim Associates created 19 videos, which are being utilized on social media platforms, streaming services, and YouTube ads. The firm has concentrated on targeting ads across social media specifically focusing on audiences that would benefit from HMGF services. Additionally, they have designed a toolkit for our affiliates to implement the insights gained from this process in their local public awareness campaigns. This toolkit comprises social media post templates, a variety of captions, the top 4 messages that have been most effective during the campaign, a sample one-month content calendar, guidance on interpreting marketing analytics, and instructions on setting up social media ads.

### NATIONAL COLLABORATIVE FOR INFANTS & TODDLERS (NCIT)

This year, Help Me Grow® Florida (HMGF) joined the National Collaborative for Infants & Toddlers (NCIT), a movement dedicated to advocating for the well-being of every child and their families from prenatal to age three. NCIT introduced the Prenatal-to-Three (PN-3) Power-Sharing Initiative to emphasize the significance of investing in policies and systems for this age group in states like Florida. In June 2023, NCIT held a meeting in Arkansas where Ashley Houk, HMGF Data Coordinator, represented the organization. Together, representatives from the five states collaborated on strategies to enhance and empower political support for the specific needs of infants, toddlers, and caregivers.

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### EARLY CHILDHOOD COURTS PILOT PROJECT

Help Me Grow® Florida (HMGF) has recently collaborated with Early Childhood Courts, a specialized court system dedicated to addressing child welfare issues for infants and toddlers. Together, they aim to enhance family outcomes by adopting Zero to Three's Infant Toddler Court Teams strategy. This method focuses on three essential components: guidance from a trauma-informed judge, Child Parent Psychotherapy, and a diverse team overseen by a community coordinator. By joining forces with HMGF, Early Childhood Courts are initiating a pilot in two counties: Marion and Brevard. This pilot project, running from April 2023 to October 2024, aims to increase the number of children in Early Childhood Courts who receive regular developmental screenings, improve their access to services, and enhance parental and caregiver involvement in their child's growth and education.
