OCALA WOMAN RECEIVES NATIONAL PUBLIC POLICY LEADERSHIP AWARD

She also learned that children in child care centers and schools were going hungry on the weekends and began a program whereby nonperishable nutritious food items are donated and distributed in back packs to children each Friday to last throughout the weekend.

"Linda is most deserving of this recognition and has made a tremendous difference in the lives of others through her public policy efforts as well as her personal commitment for change," said Phyllis Kalifeh, president and CEO of the Children's Forum who nominated Foy for the award. "Her passion and advocacy for early care and education is unbridled; the kind that our friend Sandy Skolnik embodied and would be proud to bestow."
