

According to Census data (2000), Volusia County ranked 59th of the 500 largest public school districts in the United States. For the number of all persons living in poverty in Florida, Volusia County ranked 43rd of 67 counties (11.6%) and for those younger than age 5 living in poverty, the county ranked 44th with 17.7% of all young children living in poverty (Census, 2000). Families in this county made over 4,000 calls to the local Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) agency in 2005 seeking information about various services in their communities. Nearly 10% of residents reported that they spoke a language other than English in their homes in 2000.





For the number of all persons living in poverty in Florida, Walton County ranked 31st of 67 counties (14.4%) and for those younger than age 5 living in poverty, the county ranked a higher 14th with 28.8% of all young children living in poverty (Census, 2000). 


