

Program Spotlight



Because you asked, issues of *Forum Focus* will now spotlight one of our programs or services. In doing so, other Forum departments will better understand the important role we all play in fulfilling our mission. This issue's spotlight features the **Professional Development Registries** program.

The Children's Forum maintains two registries, the Miami-Dade Professional Development Registry and the Palm Beach County Training Registry. These registries provide a central database to record the workforce qualifications of early childhood educators such as employment history, compensation, benefits, credentials earned, and college courses/training activities completed.

Funding for the registries is provided by The Children's Trust and the Children's Services Council of Palm Beach County.

Workforce trends from the registries can be used to make policy-informed decisions to improve early care and education (ECE) programs.

Professional Development Registries Fun Fact: More than 9,900 early childhood educators are active participants in the registries.






