# CHILDREN'S FORUM EMPLOYEES INVITED TO SPEAK AT NATIONAL WHITE HOUSE INITIATIVE ON EDUCATIONAL EXCELLENCE FOR HISPANICS PRESENTATION

Latino teacher recruitment in Hispanic education to be discussed

**TALLAHASSEE, FL** (April 19, 2016) Two local employees from the T.E.A.C.H. Early Childhood® Scholarship Program have been invited to speak at the White House Initiative on Educational Excellence for Hispanics national presentation on Wednesday, April 20, 2016, from 2:00-3:00 p.m. The presentation will focus on Latino teacher recruitment and Lisa Adams, Assistant Director of T.E.A.C.H., and Martha Grant, T.E.A.C.H. Counselor, will discuss what makes a T.E.A.C.H. scholarship so beneficial for a Latina early childhood professional, how T.EA.C.H. reaches out to recipients with limited English proficiency, and how community colleges are helping Hispanic T.E.A.C.H. scholars be successful. The presentation will be streamed via Google+ Hangout.

Operated by the Tallahassee-based Children's Forum, T.E.A.C.H. provides scholarships for child care teachers to work towards earning a Bachelor or Associate degree in early childhood education as well as various child care teaching credentials. Studies show that investing in high-quality early learning programs benefits our society through long-term economic gains such as a reduced crime rate, a more stable economy, and a more competent workforce. In addition, high-quality programs begin with a knowledgeable and competent workforce.

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In 2014-2015, 12,336 credit hours were taken by T.E.A.C.H. participants in Florida. In addition, 2,192 scholarships were awarded to new recipients across the state.
